David first became acquainted with Taylor Devices' founder Paul Taylor back in the late 1950's – early 1960's while he was working at TRW as an engineer working on things like the lunar descent engine that landed on the moon during the Apollo Program. David and Paul worked on several projects together throughout the 1960's.

In the early 1970's, David became an official representative of Taylor Devices and worked closely with Doug Taylor for decades. Throughout his career, David never lost the urge to invent new things. In fact, he is listed as an inventor or co-inventor on at least seven US Patents for Taylor Devices. He contributed many other ideas that we have incorporated into Taylor Devices' products.

David was not only an engineer and an inventor, but a great salesman as well. He gained the trust of so many colleagues while working on military, aerospace, and seismic applications. He was a great problem solver and always went beyond what was expected of him. David was directly responsible for many of the great relationships that the Company enjoys today with so many of those customers.

I will always cherish the times that I spent working with David. His contributions to Taylor Devices and the Engineering community in general can never be measured. He will surely be missed.
